DRESS CODE FOR PUPILS.

All pupils are expected to take a pride in their own appearance and to be smartly turned out, both in school uniform and casual dress. Uniform is worn for the formal part of the school day which includes academic lessons, lunch and other official activities. At other times pupils may be permitted to wear casual clothing but are expected to adhere to a high standard of dress, especially if representing the School or on school trips.

Items of school uniform and casual clothing may not be worn together.

Specific Items of clothing may be worn for religious reasons.

DRESS REGULATIONS FOR BOYS

Winter

Pre-Prep: Dark grey trousers of formal cut, blue polo shirt, blue school sweatshirt, regulation school socks/plain dark grey socks, black polished leather shoes (not patent). Dark grey shorts of formal cut can be worn throughout the year, but must be worn with the regulation school socks, (with the yellow and blue band at the top).

Lower School and Upper School: School blazer (for formal occasions), dark grey trousers of formal cut, blue shirt (Years 3 to 6), white shirt (Years 7 and 8) with school tie, school V-necked pullover, regulation school socks, black polished leather shoes (not patent) . Belts, if worn, should be plain and of black leather; prominent buckles are not permitted.

Boys may wear shorts all year round if they so wish.

Summer

Pre-Prep: Dark grey shorts of formal cut, blue polo shirt, blue school sweatshirt, regulation school socks, (with the yellow and blue band at the top), black polished leather shoes (not patent).

Lower School and Upper School: School blazer (for formal occasions), dark grey shorts of formal cut, short sleeved blue shirt (Years 3 to 6), short sleeved white shirt (Years 7 and 8) with school tie, school V-necked pullover, regulation school socks, black polished leather shoes (not patent) . Belts, if worn, should be plain and of black leather; prominent buckles are not permitted.

Hair must be smart and of an appropriate, uniform length, style and colour. Styling products may not be worn in the hair. Earrings may not be worn in school. Official school

sports kit must be worn for games/PE lessons and school fixtures, including the school tracksuit. If permission has been given for pupils to attend academic lessons or other formal activities in sports kit, the full tracksuit must also be worn.

DRESS REGULATIONS FOR GIRLS

Winter

Pre-Prep: Regulation school kilt to be no shorter than knee length, blue polo shirt, school sweatshirt, long navy socks, black polished leather shoes (not patent) .

Lower School and Upper School: School blazer (for formal occasions), regulation school kilt to be no shorter than knee length, blue shirt (Years 3 to 6), white shirt (Years 7 and 8) with school tie, school V-necked pullover, long navy socks, black polished leather shoes (not patent) .

Summer

Pre-Prep: Regulation summer dress to be no shorter than knee length, school sweatshirt, short white socks, black polished leather shoes (not patent) . Stiletto, kitten and wedge heels and styles with ankle straps are not permitted.

Lower School and Upper School: School blazer (for formal occasions), regulation summer dress (years 3 to 6) school kilt (Year 7 and 8) to be no shorter than knee length, short sleeved white blouse (Years 7 and 8), school V-necked pullover, plain white ankle socks (not trainer socks), black polished leather shoes (not patent) . Stiletto, kitten and wedge heels and styles with ankle straps are not permitted.

Hair must be neat, of an appropriate style, of uniform length and colour, and worn off the face. Hair should be tied up in a pony-tail, plait, bunches or bun. Hairbands and other accessories should be of a simple and inconspicuous design in navy blue. Simple gold or silver stud ear rings may be worn, one in each lobe. No other jewellery may be worn. Nail varnish may not be worn. Make-up may not be worn.

Official school sports kit must be worn for games/PE lessons and school fixtures, including the school tracksuit. If permission has been given for pupils to attend academic lessons or other formal activities in sports kit, the full tracksuit must also be worn.
