- Restrict comments to praise and encouragement, never yell at any player, official or coach.
- Advice from the sidelines only confuses children, even perceived good advice.
- At all times respect the coaches or officials, without them there would not be a game.
- Your child is a member of a team until dismissed by the coach after the team tea.
- Parents are encouraged to take an active part in making parents from visiting schools feel welcome by chatting with them on the touchline and at tea.
