What an amazing week it has been once again. A poignancy and sense of occasion emanated from three very special services that our community were involved with. Our school Remembrance Service and that of the parish, and also the Chamber Choir and Musicians' performance at the National Memorial Arboretum on Armistice Day, reminded us all of what really matters in life; the love of our children and families and the peace and respect of our society and community.

We welcome Father Neil Roberts



After university in London and Cambridge, Fr Roberts taught RS and Music at Loughborough Grammar School where he was also a Boarding house tutor. After six years he was promoted to Head of Religion and Philosophy at Reigate Grammar School, another HMC school but this time a day school. There he was also appointed Acting Chaplain and took responsibility for training teachers on PGCE courses. After ten years he took holy orders in the Church of England and has worked in parishes in the Southwark and Chichester diocese as a Vicar and Rector. Fr Roberts is also a Benedictine - a member of the religious order that founded Repton Abbey and as such he places great emphasis upon hospitality and reflection - the hallmarks of living out the Rule of Saint Benedict today, together with a growing community that live beyond the walls of the monastery.

As Vicar of Steyning, Sussex, he also taught the newly ordained Canon Law and was Boarders' Chaplain to one of the largest state boarding schools in England, Steyning CofE Grammar School.

Fr Roberts comes to the Repton family together with his wife, Helen, a Chartered Librarian, who also worked at Reigate Grammar School, and their two sons, Louis (6) and Benedict (3 in December).

A reflection on remembrance

It was a great pleasure to be invited to lead the school's Act of Remembrance on Armistice Day. I was most impressed by the quiet, the respect and the discipline of the whole school to stand for that period of time and to sing with such vigour. I must comment on the quality of the music from the choir, the brass and the whole school which enabled us all to be engaged in this important collective act of worship.

November is a time full of remembering, from All Hallow's Day on 1 November when we remember the Saints, to All Souls Day on 2nd November when we remember those whom we love and see no longer through to 'remember, remember the fifth of November' and of course the 11th day of the 11th month at the 11th hour. Memories are powerful things – whether we call to mind an experience of our own, or the collective memory to call to mind important times and the effect they still have upon us today.

The Greeks refer to this remembering as anamnesis – which means to remember is to make real. This is precisely what worship does – it enables us to be beyond our own time, to be in God's time and so by remembering we are really in that moment.

In the time to come I look forward to leading the worship of the school and to enable our children to experience something of the mystery of God – of 'heaven in ordinary' (George Herbert) – that can be glimpsed around every corner of our lives if we were to notice.

This comes with my prayers and best wishes for the rest of this term and looking forward to meeting you in due course.





As per the House tradition the four School Houses will be present at the Christmas Fayre. Each House will run a stall to raise as much money for charity as they can.


