After winning the regional qualifying tournament in style at Summer Fields last month the boys produced some stunning football at Taunton against the best football schools in the country.

Our UI3s remained unbeaten in the group stages and scoring more goals, conceding less and earning more points than anyone else in the I4 team national tournament.

They saw off the challenge of St. Christopher's in the semi-final and met reigning champions Westbrook Hay in the final.

It was goalless at full time and the boys were denied victory in a sudden death penalty shootout but can be suitably proud of their efforts and performance levels.

It is the first time in a decade they have reached the last two of the National IAPS football finals having previously reached the semi-final on three occasions and they played at a fantastic standard with some wonderful skill on display.
