


Please could all children have a carrier bag in school next week in which to bring various items home from their classroom.

# Arrangements for the last day of term Friday 29th June

#### Pre-Prep



Pre-Prep will be open on Friday 29th June but the morning session is scheduled to finish at 12.00 noon. Pre-Prep pupils should be collected between 11.45am and 12 noon.

It would be appreciated if parents could be punctual as Pre-Prep staff are required at the Prep School's Prize-Giving ceremony, which is scheduled to start at 12.20pm.

There should be no Pre-Prep pupils remaining on site after 12.00pm unless they have older siblings in the school at which point they should be with their parents.

#### Lower School

Children in Lower School may arrive later at 9.45am in time to attend the Upper School Music Concert. If this does not fit with parent schedules then a normal start time is available from 8.00am.

Children must be wearing smart uniform including a blazer.

Lower School will attend the music concert and then staff will take the children across to sit in their forms. Following the Prize Giving and speeches, children will de-reg with their form teacher from Front Green at 1.30pm.

All Lower School Pupils should be collected by 1.30pm.

# Arrangements for the last day of term Friday 29th June

#### **Upper School**

All Year 8 Pupils are expected to be in school at normal time. The Leavers' Service starts at 8.45am. Pupils in Y5-7 may arrive later at 9.45am in time for the School Concert which starts at 10.15am - they should report to their form room on arrival. If this does not fit in with parental schedules then a normal start is available and pupils should meet in the Theatre from 8am. They will remain in year groups/forms until the start of the Upper School concert which will take place in the Sports Hall from 10.15-11.30am. Parents and pupils in Upper School are invited to attend this event.

Speeches and Prize Giving will take place at Front Square from 12.20pm. At 1.30pm pupils in Y5-7 should de-reg from their forms directly from Front Square. Y5-7 Boarders can de-reg with Houseparents from Boarding Houses.

From I.40pm onwards, Year 8 pupils and their parents along with Governors and staff will be provided with a buffet lunch in the Quad. Y8 pupils and their parents will be free to leave at the end of the buffet lunch at approximately 2.40pm. Year 8 Boarders must remember to de-reg from their House. It is expected that all pupils and parents will be off site by 4pm.

ALL parents in both Upper and Lower School are welcome to picnic in the grounds after the Prize Giving Ceremony until 4pm.



# UPPER SCHOOL (Y5, Y6, Y7 & Y8) SPORTS DAY 23rd JUNE 2017

Due to the success of previous Sports Days the annual house competition will once again run at Shobnall Athletics track in Burton upon Trent. The venue has a tartan track enabling events to continue irrespective of weather conditions. This will also enable the children to enjoy this outstanding event at the end of the school year. Of course due to the location of sports day there will be some significant adjustments to the routine of the school day.

- We ask that all parents transport their Upper School pupils (Y5-Y8) straight to the Shobnall Complex, in Burton upon Trent for a 9.30am meet.
- Please sign in your son/daughter on entry to the track with Miss Dutton (Tedder), Mr Rigney (Alexander), Mrs Krbacevic (Mountbatten) and Mr Clarkson (Wavell).
- All Boarders and children in Flexi will be transported down to Shobnall.
- Please note that the normal morning and afternoon school bus services will not run on Saturday.

I do hope parents will support this event once again this year and look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at Shobnall on Saturday 23rd June. There will be no official refreshments tent, however there are limited drinks and snacks available in the leisure centre. If there are any concerns relating to the arrangements please contact your son's/daughter's Form Tutor as soon as possible.

If the weather does close in on Saturday 23rd June and we experience heavy rain, track events should be able to continue, however some field events may be limited. If, in the opinion of the Headmaster and the PE staff, conditions do become unsafe for any activity to take place during the event then an announcement will be made and Clarion call will be sent out requesting parents to collect their children from Shobnall.
