

He is founder and artistic director of the Darwin Ensemble Chamber Orchestra (DECO), with whom he recently performed Vivaldi's Four Seasons. He leads the Spires Philharmonic and is a guest leader of the Birmingham Philharmonic. Alex is a regular player and section principal of English Symphony Orchestra.

He is a graduate of **Cambridge University** and of the **Birmingham Conservatoire**.

A keen educator, Alex enjoys working with students and composers on all aspects of music and performance. He coaches for the National Children's Orchestra of Great Britain. He is also Head of Strings at <u>Uppingham School</u>.
