Work in progress



The above photograph of the southerly formal garden, commonly known as the "Headmaster's Garden", was taken this week to show progress so far.

Work is well underway with the library refurbishment and we remain on course to reopen the library for the start of the summer term.

It is not only the internal decoration that is receiving an overhaul as every Head of Department has also been involved in reviewing the library stock as we look to enhance both our fiction and non fiction sections. The old books have been recycled and the first tranche are currently on their way to schools in Africa. We are sure that the outcome will be an impressive, stimulating study area.



Whilst driving things forward in the Library the Bursar and his team are looking to turn the clock back in the southerly formal garden. Having reached a stage where the remaining lines of cypress trees were a danger to the building, had started to dominate the garden and were both detrimental and disproportionate to the setting, the decision was taken (following consultation with the planners) to return the garden to its original size and form circa 1910. Our Bursar, Richard Fletcher commented "It's a considerable undertaking for our excellent gardeners, but we are hoping that this work will be complete in time for Speech Day."

Ancient Egyptian Day Monday 2nd March



But I know it's only in my head.**






