

Rolls Royce Pays a Visit to Year Two

This term our Year Two children have been learning about 'Flight, Space and Explorers'. These topics were really brought alive through the visit of STEM engineers from Rolls Royce.

When the children were asked 'What is an engineer?' Amily Sinka (2E) stated, "My father is an engineer. When people phone up with a problem he solves it."

STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics and Rolls Royce invests considerable resources in order to engage with the next generation of potential engineers – and on Friday we certainly saw potential in many of the children in Year Two.

The children were asked to design a balloon buggy and a balloon rocket in small groups. The children had tremendous fun trying different ideas to make their vehicles travel further each time.

Robert Jones (2E) commented, "I have learnt many things today. I have found that it is good to work in groups and to listen to other ideas. And if it doesn't work, then go back to the drawing board and have another go!" An engineer in the making we think Robert!!

It certainly connected our children's thoughts of classroomlearning to the world of work. Many thanks to Mrs Barkey (Zoe's Mum 2R) for organising this fabulous afternoon.
