Dear Parents





The children enjoyed four different 'hands on' activities. In the Early Years, a farmyard arrived!! The children had to solve clues and then find the animal. We had lambs, chickens, goats, ducks, ponies, dogs, rabbits, hamsters, piglets and guinea pigs. All the animals were extremely well behaved. A huge thank you to all the parents for bringing in the animals and for making the day so special.

In Year I, the children enjoyed going 'Under the Sea'! We listened to the story of 'The Rainbow Fish' and split up into teams across the year groups to answer quiz questions about sea creatures. 
HOST FAMILIES FOR OVERSEAS BOARDERS
