## Greenpower F24 - Foremarke Racing Update and sponsorship request

In response to the enthusiasm shown by many of our new team members following our Test Day at Goodwood last week, we have decided to buy a Greenpower Kit car so that the team can experience building a car from the ground up and gain some useful engineering experience. To enable this we will use what is left of our past sponsorship funding so this is going to put a sizable dent (£2500 plus) into the funding pot! We do sustain substantial costs to keep this exciting activity going so we are always pleased to welcome corporate or private sponsorship, especially as we have now started on the new race season. Sponsorship funding goes into sustaining the existing cars (batteries, motors, tyres etc.) as well as on-going car development and hopefully new construction.

The Greenpower Kit Car is not a particularly competitive car, especially compared to our existing FR-5M & FR-6M, but the team will be able to participate in the dedicated Kit Car Final next October, along with the normal F24 International Final. The Kit Car can also be raced in the normal F24 regional qualifying events during the race season and the leading Kit Car earns a prize, regardless of its position at the chequered flag relative to other cars. Something else to aim for!
