New School Relay record for our U12 Swimmers



Congratulations to Zara, Nora, Julie and Tabitha who travelled to Crawley last weekend to compete in the IAPS National Swimming Finals. Sophie Haigh had also qualified for the National finals for both an individual and as part of the relay team but was unable to compete due to injury, so many thanks to Nora for stepping in.

The girls finished with a huge personal best time of 1:03.92 knocking two seconds off their entry time which was just fantastic considering the limited time they had been able to train together before the Nationals. This time also gave them a new school relay record and they finished 10th overall.

Congratulations also to Zara who swam with great determination to finish 5th in the National final of the 50m Backstroke knocking over 2 seconds off her qualifying time. To be in the top 8 nationally is an outstanding achievement and this is our best placed position in the last 5 years!

A team of 22 took part in the Greenpower Seasonal Opener races at the Rockingham Speedway on Wednesday. The weather was perfect with little wind to affect the cars' progress on track. This was to be the first competitive race for the new Yr.7 team members alongside the more experienced Yr.8.

The morning sessions were practice laps where the team were honing their pit stop drills and these proved to be very well executed during racing. The two 90 minute races in the afternoon were open to all categories of cars so we were competing against both our own F24 and F24+ of the senior formula. Each car had its own distinctive team of six for the two races and this worked out very well in developing some cohesion and friendly inter team rivalry to see who could service a car in and out of the pits the fastest.

Although our lead car FR-6M was third overall in both races, we were the fastest of all the school entries (our normal F24) and were only beaten by two of the senior corporate owned F24+ cars who have much older drivers (18-25) and technological ability. So, well done team!




Year 4 History

Derbyshire Healthcare Trust have taken the decision to change the provision of HPV vaccinations for all year 8 girls (and subsequent years) to be school-led. Therefore HPV vaccinations will take place in school based programmes and will no longer be available at your GP practices within Derbyshire.



If your daughter has had her first dose at the GP and is due her booster please do not be concerned as she has up to 24 months from the initial vaccination to complete the course.

It is envisaged that the school programme will be in the following academic year to the first dose. This means that you will be contacted next year once your daughter has moved on to her next school.
