Dear Parents

What a truly memorable week we have just had! The pupils experienced the trauma of 1940 Britain and the birth pangs of Foremarke, engaging in the experiences of the classroom 75 years ago with great gusto and spirit. The glorious weather iced the celebrations for 240 returning Old Foremarkians on Saturday, coupled with a glittering Diamond Ball so splendidly organised by the Friends of Foremarke. All culminated in a special Service of Thanksgiving at St. Saviour's on the Sunday, graced by the presence of the Bishop of Derby, the Rt Revd Dr Alastair Redfern.

I think we can genuinely say we recorded the 75th *Anniversary splendidly.*

I leave the final sentence to a pupil who arrived in 1946, became a much respected headmaster in the South West Midlands, who wrote in his anecdote, "from the moment Foremarke came into existence there was a wonderfully friendly and co-operative atmosphere throughout the school". I passionately believe that sentiment is as correct today as it was when Roger Gillard was a pupil here.

Thank you to everyone for making our 75th celebrations so special.

"I enjoyed the 1940's day a lot! I learnt about the past. You didn't know when the bombs might hit so, you had to get in a shelter quickly. I wouldn't have liked to live in those days as I wouldn't want to leave my parents to live with a stranger because they might be mean to me. " Lea Barkey

"I learnt about WW2 air raids. We learnt about air raid shelters. Some people hid under tables to stay safe. Germans dropped bombs and if you didn't get to the shelter in time you might be killed. My favourite part was hiding in the dark scary shelter whilst bombs were being dropped outside. We sang and it made me feel happier." Harry Thandi

"During 1940's day, Year 4 learnt some songs 'Run Rabbit Run' and practised what to do if they were bombed. We had an unexpected surprise, it was great fun" Daniel Moore

"I learnt that being bombed is scarier than you think it might be!" Lily Clancy

"I loved 'Goodnight Mr Tom', but I was really scared when we went into our Anderson shelter" Emma Dammers

Changes to Sports Fixtures on our web site

Please note that we have launched a new **Sports Fixture Module** on our web site. Now you can access the term's fixtures from the Home Page of our web site in **one click** from your computer or any mobile device.

Simply click on the circular tennis racquet and hockey stick icon or the words "Sports Fixtures" on the right hand side of the white panel on the home page.

A full list of the term's fixtures will then display in date sequence. You can use the "filter by" tab at the top of the screen to filter by sport if you require. Please do not filter by Teams as his area is still being worked on.

Click on the arrows on the left hand side to expand the fixtures when there are multiple teams playing on the same day.

Use the arrow on the right hand side next to "More info" to see the team list, any further details and a google map of the venue if the fixture is away.

Once a fixture has been played you can see the match report by clicking on the "Results" tab.

You will note that there is a rolling banner at the very top of the page where we will highlight any fixtures that have been added or any changes that are not in the printed calendar.


