## Year 3 Visit to Creswell Crags

It was a beautiful autumnal day last Friday when Year 3 went on their History trip to Creswell Crags - a limestone gorge with many caves, where both Stone Age tools and fossils have been found dating from the last Ice Age between 50,000 and 10,000 years ago.



"I liked looking at all of the fossils especially the cave lion skull with some of its teeth. My group was given a box full of hyena bones and we had to try and guess what all of the bones were.
