## From the Headmaster

Dear Parents

A new study by the Department of Education has found 30,000 fewer children were bullied in the last 10 years compared with a decade before. Whilst this is a significant and welcome decline, the figure still remains in my mind too high. No child should feel the hurt and pain caused by the varied forms of bullying. Any school which claims it has no bullying is deluding itself. The most important thing is to ensure quality systems are in place to protect and support.

Our visiting speaker Robert Higgs at Monday's assembly is an author and presenter on anti-bullying who has been featured on BBC Radio 1 & 2 as well as BBC Breakfast on television and is an active member of Anti-bullying alliance. He spoke to the pupils about ways to recognise, challenge and resolve bullying issues. This clear message reflects that which we always tell the pupils; tell someone — make a noise. Robert provided excellent strategies for the pupils to apply in difficult or challenging situations. The pupils thoroughly enjoyed his presentation, gaining a great deal from it and having reinforced the messages which we as a school deliver regularly.

#### Headmaster discovers Foremarke jug

The Headmaster 'discovered' this tiny jug on an internet auction site recently. It was part of the reveal to Frank Gardner but not aired in the BBC programme 'Who Do You Think You Are?' We are extremely grateful to Mr Jonny Coulborn for his expert research on its style and age and by whom it was painted.

Apparently it was made at the Derby factory, circa 1780 and shows a view across Foremarke. The image is one of only two known of the former Jacobean House which formerly occupied this site prior to the wonderful Palladian splendour of the current Hall. The other image is a small sketch which has only been seen in reproduction. The image on the jug may well have been painted by either 'Jockey' Hill or Zachariah Boreman one of the many talented artists painting at the factory at the time. It may have been painted from the original sketch as opposed to on site.


