Some parents may already be aware that last year Jane Rushton, one of our school nurses, lost her daughter Sophie, aged 13, following a prolonged illness.

Sophie had complex medical needs since birth and was supported by Rainbows for her entire life. Sophie and her family spent her last 6 weeks having end of life care at the Rainbows Hospice in Loughborough and her family continue to be supported now.

Rainbows is completely funded by charity donations and costs $\pounds 4$ million per annum to run.

As a school we are determined to raise funds so other children and families can receive this quality of care and support when they need it most.

- Your child is a member of a team until dismissed by the coach after the team tea.
- Parents are encouraged to take an active part in making parents from visiting schools feel welcome by chatting with them on the touchline and at tea.
