From the Headmaster

Dear Parents

In the week which has seen Leicester City crowned Premier League Champions, much has been said, written and theorised into how and why they have achieved the seemingly impossible. This wasn't meant to happen. They have lived their dreams, pursued their extrinsic goals and done so collectively, to hugely rewarding effect upon themselves, their families, the Club, the City, the Region, the Country and even Worldwide.

Perhaps the biggest difference between team and individual sports is what motivates athletes. In solo activities, such as long-distance running, swimming (congratulations, Poppy) and cycling, the athlete is responsible for the training and strategy required to ensure success, whilst it is the team working together which guarantees the victory. I believe each should play whichever sports they enjoy, team or individual. We are all different and each will naturally be attracted to whichever they find more successful and enjoyable.

According to recent studies, only 45% of 10 year old boys participate in sports. By the age of 18 only 26% of them stay active. Presently, there is a huge drop-out from sport amongst adolescents. In all sports, almost half as many 16-24 year old women take part in sport as men of the same age while only 15% of girls aged 15 in the UK meet recommended daily physical activity levels.

These figures are woeful. The rich sporting background both team and individual at Foremarke gives each child the opportunity to perform, enjoy and benefit both physically and mentally from their engagement. Long live sport!


