

From the Headmaster

Dear Parents

The cheers at the end of the Common Entrance (CE) examinations for Y8 were audible on Thursday morning. The pupils have acquitted themselves splendidly throughout the examination period. They are now busy preparing themselves for their visit to Anglesey next week. They will receive their results upon return.

Years 5, 6 and 7 are now into their internal examinations. For all it can be a very pressured time but I am very pleased how calmly the vast majority are approaching the challenge. Remaining calm has been the theme of the week and gentle strategies have been extended to all through assemblies and lessons.

Much is reported in the press regarding examination stress. The demands on pupils in the south at both 11+ and 13+ are now considered by many to be truly excessive, narrowing children's education to a repetitive diet of an academic exclusive curriculum. Similarly, the constraints of KS Tests and OFSTED statistic driven expectations blight the wholeness of the educational experience. School days should be the happiest days of your life. I am delighted our pupils' experience is rich, broad and balanced, allowing children to prosper and thrive in a multitude of arena, a smile never being far from their faces. Here I see children growing constantly in confidence and self-esteem, sitting examinations with calmness, assuredly taking ownership of their outcomes and celebrating the results

Year 3 Science Day


