Year 7 trip to Whitemoor Lakes

Year 7 is an important year in the academic life of Foremarke children. It is a time when they are expected to have a lot more self-discipline and a more mature attitude towards each other and their work. In Year 7 they are entering a more senior section of the school and will need to be more self-reliant than before with regards to their school work and prep.

To assist the transition from Year 6 to Year 7, I have organised an Outward Bound Activity Trip to Whitemoor Lakes on 6th and 7th September 2018, which includes overnight accommodation. The cost of the two-day trip should be in the region of £140 although this is ultimately dependent on numbers. Dear Parents,

I am writing to you with information which I hope will be useful about the teaching groups and curriculum in Year 7 for 2018-2019.

Form Placement

The decisions as to which pupils are placed into which teaching groups are managed by the Form Placement Committee which is made up of the Headmaster (RPM), Assistant Head (Admin) (PGM), Assistant Head (Academic) (PAB), Assessment & Reporting Coordinator (SK), Head of Maths (JWD), Head of English (SLG), Head of Science (CEW) and Head of Learning Enhancement (LSW). The process is extremely thorough and robust, and aims to place each individual child into the best possible teaching group for them. It is carried out in a rigorous and professional manner and involves many hours of discussion based on extensive data, along with whole-staff consultation. Parents will be informed of the details of their child's form placement for next year at the end of this term. Once finalised, no further changes are made until the end of the review period which takes place during the first half of the Michaelmas Term. Parents who wish to raise any concerns regarding form placement should do so in writing to the Headmaster.

Common Entrance and Academic Scholarship

The Common Entrance course is nationwide, rigorous in its content and the examinations are used for assessing all pupils who transfer to senior school at the age of 13+. The syllabuses are devised and regularly monitored by the Independent Schools Examinations Board, full details of which can be found on the ISEB website, www.iseb.co.uk The papers are set by examiners appointed by the Board, but they **are marked by the senior school** for which a candidate is entered. The subjects included are: Mathematics, English, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, French, History, Geography, Religious Studies and Latin/Classical Studies.

The Academic Scholarship course is extremely demanding and is tailored to those pupils who are likely to sit Academic Scholarships to their chosen senior school. As well as a very high cognitive ability level, pupils who follow this route will be expected to show high levels of effort, perseverance, resilience, motivation, passion and a willingness to work hard. The subjects included are the same as at Common Entrance.

Streaming and Setting

This year's three forms will be extended to five teaching groups – 7PS, 7/1a, 7/1b, 7/2a and 7/2b. As well as our current Year 6 cohort, we will be joined by a good number of new pupils from other schools, all of whom have undergone assessment and will be placed into the appropriate teaching group by the Form Placement committee. The anticipated route of progression from Year 6 into Year 7 is as follows:

 $6RN \rightarrow 7PS \text{ or } 7/1a$ $6NW \text{ and } 6AE \rightarrow 7/1b, 7/2a \text{ or } 7/2b$

7PS (Potential Scholars) will be populated by those pupils who are deemed to show the right credentials to follow the scholarship curriculum and who are likely to sit academic scholarship examinations in spring of 2020.

There will then be four Common Entrance classes. These classes follow the Common Entrance syllabuses which prepare them well for their studies at GCSE level and beyond.

7/1a and 7/1b will each follow the same timetable structure which includes Latin. They will be of comparable ability, with setting put into place for Mathematics, English and French. The remaining examinable subjects will be taught as streamed classes.

7/2a and 7/2b will each follow the same timetable structure which includes Classical Studies and an additional period each of English and Maths. They will be of comparable ability levels, with setting put into place for Maths, English and French. The remaining examinable subjects will be taught as parallel classes.

Year 6 trip to Castleton: 5th – 7th September 2018

Year 6 is an important year in the academic life of Foremarke children. To assist the transition from Year 5 to Year 6, I have organised an outward bound activity trip to the Peak District in September. 8S will be populated by those pupils who are deemed to show the right credentials to follow the scholarship curriculum, and who are destined to sit academic scholarship examinations in spring of 2019.

There will then be four Common Entrance classes. These classes follow the Common Entrance syllabuses which prepare them well for their studies at GCSE level and beyond.

8/1a and 8/1b will each follow the same timetable structure which includes Latin. They will be streamed by ability, with setting put into place for Mathematics, English and French. The remaining examinable subjects will be taught as streamed classes.

8/2a and 8/2b will each follow the same timetable structure which includes Classical Studies and an additional period each of English and Maths. They will be of comparable ability levels, with setting put into place for Maths, English and French. The remaining examinable subjects will be taught as parallel classes.

The anticipated route of progression from Year 7 into Year 8 is as follows:

 $7PS \rightarrow 8S \text{ or } 8/1a$ $7/1a \rightarrow 8/1a \text{ or } 8/1b$ $7/2a, 7/2b \text{ or } 7/2c \rightarrow 8/1b, 8/2a \text{ or } 8/2b$

Interim Reports (Years 7 & 8)

Please find enclosed the third and final interim report for your child this academic year.

This report is intended to give your child a clear and honest indication of how they are doing with respect to their school work this half term. It reports on effort and outcomes. **The outcomes grade is relative to your child's particular teaching group.** They may be in different teaching groups for different subjects and so it is important to take into account any setting information. The highest possible grade is therefore 5O which indicates that a pupil is working with outstanding levels effort, and that their work is outstanding within their teaching group.

Although the outcomes grade is significant, we will always emphasise to pupils the importance of the effort grade. It follows that if they are applying very good levels of effort to all of their work then their outcomes grade is also likely to be good.

Your child has already seen this report and has used it to set targets, in consultation with their form tutors, which they should work to achieve once they return to school after the Christmas break.

I hope that you will find this report useful, and that you will discuss it with your child, paying particular attention to any targets/comments made by their subject teachers and their form tutor.

Finally, I would ask that you complete the reply slip below and return it to your child's form tutor. I wish you a good and restful half-term break.

AFTER THE HALF TERM BREAK

Please ensure that children doing examinations return with spare pens, calculators, protractors, stationery etc, so that first thing on Tuesday morning (and indeed on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday mornings!) "Have I got the right kit?" is not a worry for anyone.

I reiterate my belief of the importance of a balanced break and of how disruptive electronic devices can be to work and rest.

When the examinations finish on Friday morning we will have some photographic fun: a formal Leavers' photograph will be taken at noon. This will be followed at 1.10pm by an informal – actually it's traditionally <u>very informal</u> – Leavers' photograph, so children need to consider their outfits/props and pose over half term. We will then talk to them about the Post-Examination Programme and our expectations.

All children need to return any school texts they may have borrowed. **They will also need to return with a named paperback and a pen** to read in case of a sudden downpour or while we have to wait somewhere for something. **This paperback is essential and also acts as a child's passport into the next activity during the post exam program.** The children should take an active role and not assume that they will be entertained without effort on their part.

The Year 8 children should be in school uniform. We will tell the children in advance when they need to be wearing something different. We do not want sweets or any expensive electronic items brought into school. Our advice is always to leave valuable items at home.

The Year 8 OB trip to Wales runs from Monday, 11th to Friday, 15th June. This is often described by Leavers as the highlight of their 'Foremarke experience.' The CE results should be delivered to parents at home by post (please DO NOT try to phone the children) and to the children on their return. In the highly unlikely event of a problem with CE, Mr Merriman will already have been in touch with you. We would be grateful if **day parents would time their arrival on Front Square for a 6.30pm pick up,** that will allow time for us to communicate results and for you to join your child in celebration.

The preparations for the Year 8 Leavers' Ball proceed. Pick up time from Front Square will be 10.00pm that evening, Saturday, 23rd June and we look forward to the usual tasteful and eccentric variety of conveyances. Please contact me if you are in any doubt as to the suitability or safety of your plans.
