Richard Merriman joined BBC journalist Frank Gardner in this episode of last season's "Who Do You Think You Are?".

At the beginning of the programme, it was revealed that Frank said his mother had always told him the family arrived in Britain with the Normans - and he was keen to discover if there was any truth in the family rumour. After finding out about his grand-parents, Frank was pointed further back by a family member to a connection with the Burdett family, who lived at Foremarke. As a result, Frank visited Foremarke Hall where Richard explained the Burdett's had lived in a former grand house on the site.

Mr Merriman went on to advise Frank to find out more about his family member, Sir Michael Stanhope. Having taken the advice and researched several steps further back, security correspondent Frank ultimately discovered he is a direct descendant of William the Conqueror!

You may have also caught a swift glimpse of Foremarke Hall in an episode of the BBC's mini-series "The Stuarts" which explained that in 1745 Swarkestone Bridge was the southernmost point of Bonnie Prince Charlie's march on London in his attempt to claim the British throne. Finding no support from the local landed gentry in the south, which included Foremarke Hall, his army turned back and retreated to Scotland and their final defeat at the Battle of Culloden.
